

## Minutes of Men's Coffee Group – October 25, 2011

Ambulance Service – a County Commissioner's Meeting was being held to decide who should be responsible for Bonita Springs Emergency Medical Service:

- (a) The Bonita Springs Fire Department – supported by Bonita Springs City Council, or
- (b) Lee County EMS – supported by Lee County Officials.

It was mentioned, that three ambulances would be needed, if the Bonita Springs Fire Dept. provided service at a cost of approximately \$1 Million. It was also reported, that this money has already been budgeted.

Although not as serious an issue as the Bonita Springs EMS – another issue discussed was the Bonita Springs Library. Possible choices:

- (a) Should Bonita Springs have its own library?
- (b) Could Bonita do a better job than Lee County, and
- (c) Is the City being short changed by Lee County?

The Finance Committee has been given copies of Pulte's Proposed Budget and has been asked for opinions. Tom Wade mentioned that this was the first time that Pulte has asked for opinions from the Finance Committee with respect to the Budget.

A Special Amendment Meeting is to be held on November 1st at 60 pm. If your proxy was sent in for the first meeting (Sept), and you do not intend to make any changes, then you do not need to attend this Meeting. However, if you haven't voted, or did not attend the previous meeting, you need to attend this Meeting.

It was mentioned that the HOA Board Meetings are "Public Meetings"; the public is welcome to attend. However, they are held infrequently. Kathryn Halas answered the following questions:

A member asked if the lap pool was being heated, as he did not think so. Kathryn stated that the temperature had been tested that day, and was at 84 degrees.

Kathryn was asked if Pulte was still collecting \$1,000 per home for the Capital Fund. She stated to the best of her knowledge it was.

Kathryn asked if we thought that a discussion held by some Village Walk Residents knowledgeable about Florida wild life would be welcomed. The consensus for such a discussion was positive, since we have had some issues here at Village Walk with respect to bear, coyotes and snakes.

At the Bonita East Stakeholder's Meeting, held on December 1st at our Town Center, Captain Kathryn Rairden, from the Lee County Sheriff's Office, mentioned that all complaints regarding shooting and SUV Noise should be reported to the Lee County Sheriff's Office – Phone No. 239-477-1000 – not the Sub-Station as stated above.
